NOTES AND NEWS.

Mr. Louis Brennan—or torpedo Brennan as he is familiarly called at Chatham—has had an interesting career. He is an Irishman by birth and a Home Ruler by politics. It appears that as a young man—he is not more than thirty-six now—he emigrated to the colonies, and obtained a boy's place in an establishment after the Whitley principle. The proprietor had a cargo of clocks sent from England. The salt air played havoc with the clocks and stopped a great number. Young Brennan—who always had a mechanical genius—got hold of the clocks and soon set them all going, much to the master's delight. Soon afterwards he invented his torpedo, or rather, as he puts it, dreamt it. He luckily fell in with Mr. Temperley, an engineer of Newcastle, who took it up, made himself responsible for the drawings, and found the money. The first torpedo was constructed in pieces in different parts of the world, and before the English Government decided to purchase it, which they did for £120,000, the inventor and engineers were hard at work for two years at Chatham on the torpedo. Mr. Louis Brennan lives at Gillingham, Chatham, and drives some very spirited horses. He is a first sight of hand conjurer. He is a bachelor.
